EXPLANATION:

This emergency order closes the state resident registration permit hunt RG869 for mountain goats in Unit 14(C). All other goat hunting seasons in Unit 14 are unaffected by this emergency order.

REGULATION:

Therefore, the following regulations in 5AAC 85.040(7), **Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Goats**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective for hunting goats:

Remainder of Unit 14(C), that portion within the drainages of Knik River upstream from, but not including, Big Timber Creek drainage

RESIDENT HUNTERS:

1 goat by registration permit only; however, goats may be taken from Aug. 16 through Aug. 31 by bow and arrow only; the taking of nannies with kids is prohibited.

Aug. 16- Oct. 9

All other goat hunting regulations in Unit 14 remain unchanged and are not affected by this emergency order.

JUSTIFICATION:

A mountain goat survey of the Lake George hunt area conducted in July 2016 indicated the hunt area contains a minimum of 315 goats, 21 percent of which are kids. To ensure meeting the population objective of at least 500 goats in GMU 14C that will sustain an annual harvest of 25 goats, comprising at least 60 percent males, harvest from this area should not exceed 18 goat units. The Lake George area is managed with separate registration hunts for resident and nonresident hunters. Twelve of the total goat units are allotted for residents holding permit RG869. Total goat units are calculated using one unit for billies and two units for nannies. Currently, 10 goat units (1 nanny and 8 billies) have been harvested by resident hunters from the Lake George drainage, and hunters currently remain in the field. To ensure the quota for RG869 is not exceeded, this hunt will close at 11:59 p.m. on October 9, 2016.
