EXPLANATION:

This emergency order closes the resident and nonresident mountain goat hunting season in the Whale Bay and Necker Bay hunt zones of RG150 on Baranof Island in Game Management Unit 4. This emergency order takes effect at 11:59 PM, Friday, November 25, 2022.

REGULATION:

Therefore, the provisions of **5 AAC 85.040, Hunting seasons and bag limits for goat**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

Units and Bag Limits	Resident Open Season (Subsistence and General Hunts	Nonresident Open Season
... Unit 4, Whale Bay – Drainages east of Small Arm Whale Bay/Creek, east of Benzeman Lake, west of Great Arm Whale Bay/Creek to the pass at Peak 2907 and drainages of Politofski Lake. Necker Bay – The peninsulas west of Small Arm Whale Bay/Creek, west of Benzeman Lake and southeast of Crawfish Inlet, but excluding Aspid Cape.	Aug. 1 – Nov. 25 (General hunt only)	Aug. 1 – Nov. 25

1 goat by registration permit only, the taking of nannies with kids is prohibited.

All other mountain goat hunting regulations in Unit 4 remain unchanged and are not affected by this emergency order.

JUSTIFICATION:

Hunt managers set a combined harvest quota of 3 males or 1 female for the Whale Bay and Necker Bay hunt zones of mountain goat hunt RG150 on Baranof Island. Quotas are based on the most recent aerial surveys. In 2011, hunt managers devised the strategy of closing hunt zones when one female goat was harvested. This strategy has been very effective in reducing female harvest. This “one and done” policy not only reduces female harvest in areas where there may be population concerns, but helps maintain high harvest opportunities for male goats. Keeping hunters focused on avoiding female harvest maintains opportunities for more hunters to participate, especially in hunt zones that have good access.

To date, five male goats have been harvested in the Whale Bay and Necker Bay hunt zones of RG150. The management objective for these zones has been exceeded and no further harvest is warranted. Additional harvest could lead to reduced hunting opportunities in the future. Therefore, this zone is being closed by emergency order.
