EXPLANATION:

This emergency order prohibits the filleting, mutilating (excluding gutting and gilling) and de-heading of lingcod, nonpelagic rockfish, and king and coho salmon at sea by marine boat anglers during designated times and areas within Southeast Alaska.

REGULATION:

The provisions of 5 AAC 47.030(m) are added by this emergency order and become effective at 12:01 a.m. April 22, 2024. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective:

5 AAC 47.030. Methods, means, and general provisions – Finfish.

(m) In Southeast Alaska, marine boat anglers possessing sport caught lingcod, nonpelagic rockfish, king and coho salmon, and returning to any port on the road system of the communities listed below, during the times designated, may not fillet, mutilate (excluding gutting and gilling), or de-head these fish until their vessel is tied up at a docking facility where the fish will be offloaded, unless the fish have been consumed or preserved on board:

JUSTIFICATION:

The department conducts on-site creel sampling programs in Southeast Alaska to estimate sport fishing effort, harvest, contributions of hatchery and certain wild stocks of king and coho salmon, length and sex composition of lingcod, and length of nonpelagic rockfish. If anglers fillet, de-head, or process fish before returning to port, ADF&G staff will not be able to collect this information critical to management of the fisheries. Without the ability to sample these species while intact, the department would have a reduced ability to calculate the contribution of Alaska hatchery-produced salmon, comply with provisions of the Pacific Salmon Treaty related to the recovery of coded wire tags, estimate the sport removals of lingcod and nonpelagic rockfish which is needed to comply with management plans, and collect biological data useful to monitor the sustainability of the fisheries.

The Alaska Board of Fisheries adopted regulations (5 AAC 75.003(3)) giving the department authority to restrict these activities by emergency order during times and in locations necessary for scientific data collection. These actions are important to fisheries management. This regulation will be in effect for the duration of the creel sampling programs. Anglers returning to these ports still have the ability to consume king or coho salmon, lingcod, and nonpelagic rockfish on board, as well as preserve these fish, if they so choose, before offloading.
