### **EXPLANATION:**

This emergency order closes the first three days of the personal use set gillnet fishery at the mouth of the Kasilof River.

### **REGULATION:**

The provisions of 5 AAC 77.540(b)(1) are superseded by this emergency order. Under this emergency order the following provisions are effective 6:00 a.m. Wednesday, June 18 through 11:00 p.m. Tuesday, June 24, 2025.

#### **5 AAC 77.540. Upper Cook Inlet Personal Use Salmon Fishery Management Plan.**

### **JUSTIFICATION:**

To protect early-run king salmon bound for the Kenai River and wild king salmon bound for Crooked Creek, the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) has determined that a reduction in fishing days is warranted in the Kasilof River personal use set gillnet fishery. ADF&G manages Kenai River early-run king salmon to achieve an optimal escapement goal (OEG) of 3,900-6,600 king salmon, and the Kasilof River king salmon sport fishery to achieve a sustainable escapement goal of 700-1,400 naturally-produced king salmon as monitored through a weir on Crooked Creek. Neither goals were achieved in 2024.
