- Lower River: Alissa Rogers (Lower River Subsistence) commented that CPUE was satisfactory. Ms.
  Rogers reported after approximately three hours of fishing she caught thirty Coho, ten chums, and four
  spawned out sockeye.
- Middle River: Lisa Feyereisen (Middle River Subsistence alternate) reported that people are still fishing very successfully.
- Upriver: Barbara Carlson (Member at Large alternate) reported that Coho salmon are starting to arrive.

- 1. **Overview of Kuskokwim River Salmon Run Assessment Projects:** Nick Smith (ADF&G) provided an overview of the ADF&G assessment projects. (For more information on the 2019 in season assessment projects, please see the August 14 Informational Packet).
- <u>Bethel Test Fish:</u> Primarily Coho (and some chum salmon) are being caught at BTF. Over the past few days, subsistence fishers have been setting nets near where BTF operations occur, which could have caused CPUE to be lower during those times. As of August 14<sup>th</sup>, Coho numbers appear to be building at BTF. Operations will cease August 24<sup>th</sup>.
- <u>Chinook Aerial Survey:</u> Surveys were conducted between July 24<sup>th</sup> and July 29<sup>th</sup>. All Chinook escapement goals were met. Three escapement goals were exceeded.
- Sonar: Overall, sonar had a successful season. Operations ceased July 26th.
- Weirs: Chinook salmon escapement goals were met at the Kwethluk River weir and exceeded at the George and Kogrukluk River weirs. Both chum and sockeye salmon escapement goals were also exceeded at the Kogrukluk River weir. It is still too early to report on Coho salmon escapement at Kogrukluk, however, numbers appear to be tracking similarly to previous years.
- <u>Subsistence Division project update:</u> No projects in the water.
- 2. **Sport Fishing:** Lamont Albertson (Sport Fishing) reported that fishing guides are doing well.
