#### June 23, 2021

This meeting of the Kuskokwim River Salmon Management Working Group was called to order at approximately 10:01 a.m. and adjourned at 12:31 p.m. A quorum was established with 9 full voting members present at the start of the meeting. Alissa Rodgers (Lower River Subsistence) chaired the meeting.

#### AGENDA ITEMS

- **A.** USFWS/KRITFC UPDATE: Audio for this update begins at 08:35 Meeting Audio 06/23/21
  - Boyd Bilhovde (USFWS) spoke about the situations surrounding the announcement of the June 19 subsistence opener. He said that it was hectic to get the opener information out due to the new Juneteenth holiday. He apologized for any confusion that came from that. He thanked Dan Gillikin, Nick Smith, and others for information about the Aniak Box.
- **A. ADF&G MANAGEMENT ACTIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION:** Audio begins at 13:40 Meeting Audio 06/23/21
  - Nick Smith (ADF&G) stated that assessment data supported a 12-hour subsistence opener in Subsistence Sections 1-3 and that he was looking at Monday, June 28 from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. to coincide with the tides.
  - There was discussion between Kevin Whitworth, LaMont Albertson, Nick Smith that followed regarding salmon run timing and assessment data. *Please refer to the meeting audio for more on this discussion.*
- **B. PEOPLE TO BE HEARD:** Non-Working Group Members: Audio begins at 21:20– Meeting Audio 06/23/21
  - Adolph Lupie (Tuntutuliak) spoke about the tide cycles for the coming week and said that more fish would be coming in. He said that chum salmon will be increasing near the mouth of the Tuntutuliak River and the peak will be around July 3 or 4.
- C. CONTINUING BUSINESS: Audio for subsistence reports begins at 30:49 Meeting Audio 06/23/21
  - Subsistence Reports: Lowest River, ONC Inseason Subsistence Report, Lower River, Middle River, Upper River, Headwaters
    - - Lowest River
    - Adolph Lupie (Tuntutuliak) see statement above for people to be heard.
    - ONC Inseason Subsistence Report:
    - Deja Jackson and Delen Hooper (ONC) presented the ONC Inseason Subsistence Report. *Please see* the Information Packet pages 3–5 and meeting audio for this presentation.
    - Lower River
    - John Andrew (Kwethluk; Downriver Elder / YK Delta RAC) stated that he had participated in the June 19 opener and used a 5.5-inch net to target red salmon. He said that in 3 hours he caught 17 reds, 5 chums, and 5 kings. He noticed that people mostly caught fish towards the end of the opener time.
    - Mike Williams, Sr. (Akiak, Lower River Subsistence) noticed an increase in fish above Akiak during the June 19 opener. He stated that the average catch was 20-30 per fisherman and that most did not fish the entire opener. He remarked that families needed another opportunity to fish before the weather changes and flies come out.
    - Avery Hoffman (Bethel, KRITFC) went out to fish camps during the past opener. He said that he had seen some fish jumping in the river. People that he had talked to had quit early.
    - Middle River
    - Allen Simeon (Aniak, Upriver Elder) said that he had done well fishing near Aniak at his setnet location. He stated that the 6-inch mesh regulation worked well because some of the larger female kings were able to get out of his net while he caught some smaller and more medium-sized kings. He said those that drifted all day were getting about 10 kings. He stated that the water in Aniak has been

clearing up and red and chum salmon numbers should be improving this upcoming week.

- Walter Morgan (Lower Kalskag; Middle River Subsistence) noticed that in the past week there were only a few boats out on the river. The average catch per day has been about 10 kings and not many reds or chums. He stated that not too many people were out fishing from Kalskag to Aniak, they are taking their time and waiting for reds and chums to arrive.
- Dan Gillikin (Aniak) stated fishing had been hit or miss and that the fish wheel had just been installed in Napaimute.
- o Upper River
- Ruby Egrass (Red Devil; Upriver Subsistence) stated that about 6 kings, of all sizes, had been caught near Red Devil in the last week.
- Headwaters
- Kevin Whitworth (McGrath, Western Interior RAC) stated that the water has been coming up in McGrath and has brought in lots of debris. He said that not many people had been fishing because of this. There had been maybe 10 kings caught so far in his area, most people were catching pike, whitefish, and sheefish.
- Inseason Harvest Report (ONC/KRITFC):

    - There was some discussion between Working Group members, Boyd Blihovde (USFWS) and Spencer Rearden (USFWS) about chum and king salmon concerns along with red salmon / chum salmon to king ratios. Please refer to the meeting audio for more on this discussion.
