July 31st, 2024

On Wednesday, July 31st, 2024, the KRSMWG meeting was called to order at 10:01 a.m. and adjourned at 11:35 a.m. Meeting time was approximately 2 hours. A quorum was established with 8 full voting members in attendance, though 2 members and 1 alternate joined after roll call had been taken. Lamont Albertson chaired the meeting.

AGENDA ITEMS AND SUMMARY INFORMATION:

- **A. USFWS/KRITFC UPDATE:** Audio for this update begins at 14:20 Meeting Audio 7/31/2024
 - Spencer Rearden, USFWS, said that the refuge staff had met with KRITFC regarding future subsistence openers, and they had decided on 2 12-hour drift- or setnet opportunities on August 5th and 10th. Gillnets will still be restricted to 6-inch or less. It was also decided to open all waters within the Yukon Delta National Wildlife Refuge to subsistence rod and reel fishing beginning on August 1st. Mr. Rearden said the announcement will be posted on their website, Facebook, distributed by email and hopefully with KYUK. Refuge staff will also update their info line.
- **B. ADF&G MANAGEMENT ACTIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION:** Audio for this update begins at 16:45 Meeting Audio 7/31/24
 - Dave Runfola, ADFG, said that there were no new recommendations for management actions and reminded everyone management actions in place within state waters in the Aniak box and upriver from there.

B. PEOPLE TO BE HEARD:

• There were no people to be heard at this meeting.

D. CONTINUING BUSINESS:

- Subsistence Reports: Lower River, Middle River, Upper River, ONC In-season Subsistence Report
 - Lower River
 - Albert Kawagley, Bethel, said that many people have stopped fishing, and it was time for berry picking, but people may still want fish to put in the freezer. Audio for this update begins at 19:05 – Meeting Audio – 7/31/2024
 - Henry Hunter, Bethel, said that talking to others he heard that people did good, and the weather had been good for the most recent opener. He continues, now we are in the rainy season but there is still an opportunity to fish for coho salmon. Mr. Hunter said that a lot of families are catching sockeye and chums and waiting for coho to come into the river. He said most people fillet and freeze them, but a few people try to dry and smoke them, however they must be checked on often because of the wet weather. Mr. Hunter wanted to make sure that people were notified about the openings that had just been announced. Audio for this update begins at 20:10 Meeting Audio 7/31/2024
 - Kara Domnick, Bethel, said she did not fish this week but was gifted some coho from a family friend. She will go berry picking over the next week or two. Audio for this update begins at 22:45 – Meeting Audio – 7/31/2024
 - Avery Hoffman, Bethel, said that he had been away to conduct the drone survey project that had been planned for the Kwethluk River. Mr. Hoffman said that

the group floated from Boundary Lake and took continuous photos and conducted habitat studies. He said the project and float had been enjoyable and went smoothly. Mr. Hoffman said the crew from Washington State University is headed back home. He will not have data or updates till later when their crew is able to get the photos into the computer and enlarge them so they can do counts. - James Nicori, Kwethluk, said that he had not heard any complaints. People in Kwethluk put away chums, sockeye, and Chinook salmon and are getting ready for berry picking. Mr. Nicori said that he had not seen anyone driftnetting recently and thinks that people are done fishing. He said that he felt the Chinook were missed there because of the timing of the openers. He continued that people were catching more above and below them. He felt the salmon had been below average this season, but that people still got what they needed. Mr. Nicori said that in some areas the berries were still green, small, or half-ripe but thought it could be a plentiful year for berries. - Mike Williams, Akiak, said that it had been a good summer and there were very few fish spoiled. He mentioned that they had seen a lot more chum salmon this summer and felt that it was a good sign. He added there were plenty of sockeye that residents of Akiak were able to dry and/or can. Mr. Williams said that they have had no power in the village for the last month and a half and have been limiting generator use and trying to maintain resources to keep personal generators running. He thanked ONC for loaning pressure cookers to help people can and preserve fish and will be returning them after August is over. He also thanked the community of Bethel and the hovercraft for their contributions as well. Mr. Williams commented that he felt the discrepancy between Bethel Test Fish and sonar data may be in part due to high water. Audio for this update begins at 35:15 Meeting Audio 7/31/2024
 - Mr. Albertson asked Mr. Williams about the size of the sockeye that had been caught in Akiak and Mike confirmed that the sockeye have been smaller. Mr. Williams added that he had to switch to 5-inch mesh. A brief conversation follows about the average size of multiple species of salmon.
- ONC In-season Report
 - Briana Henry, ONC, said that the natural resources department has been concentrating on culture camp so did not have a report for this week. Ms. Henry answered a few questions about the camp and how it went. She said it went well and spoke about some of the things they did. Audio for this update begins at 26:55 Meeting Audio 7/31/2024

■ Justin Leon, KRITFC, spoke about the harvest summaries that are included beginning on page 8 of the Informational Packet. He said the Community Based Harvest Monitors are currently standing down but will be gathering information for the next opener on August 5th. The Takotna weir is currently in a "high water outage." Mr. Leon said that it will be hard to come up with an estimate for escapement from that weir because of how much and how many times it has been out because of high water. KRITFC is considering ending operations at the weir but has not made an official decision. Mr. Leon complimented Avery Hoffman on his report about the drone project. He continued that they are still collecting data at the weir and are looking at other ways to look at information. He hopes that during years like these they will have other ways to count fish. Middle River

- Walter Morgan, Lower Kalskag, said that he had seen 1 boat driftnetting the previous day for jarring salmon. Mr. Morgan said that he had gone out 2 weeks prior and caught 30 chum, 5 sockeye and 1 Chinook salmon. He said the chums were half-dried and jarred and now he is done fishing, and it is time for berries until the coho salmon are here. Mr. Morgan plans to try jarring some coho. - Lamont Albertson, Aniak, said that he had heard that the water was high in Aniak, but he did not have anything to report. Audio for this update begins at 45:40 Meeting Audio 7/31/2024
- NVN Report
 - Dan Gillikin, NVN, said that he had just returned from the George River to help with the intern project. He said that fishing in Aniak had been slow, but people were catching some fish in town. Mr. Gillikin reported that there were a lot of sheefish at the mouth of the Aniak. He finished his report by saying that most people were done driftnetting. Upriver and Headwaters

- Barbara Carlson, Sleetmute, said that people are putting things away and the coho had not reached that part of the river yet, but she hopes to see more rod and reeling. She said people have been out picking berries and the salmon berries are doing well, but not many blueberries and it looks good for cranberries this fall. - Dan Esai, Nikolai, said that it had been a successful year in Nikolai but that it had been hot so there are not many berries because they had dried out. He added that the cranberries did not look good either. Mr. Esai said that he was making plans to head up to Telida to pick berries. He finished that the chum salmon and

- Albert Kawagley, Bethel, said that his children had gone out looking for berries in several spots and finally found a place where they were able to pick 5 gallons.
- Overview of the Kuskokwim River salmon run assessment

 - Sean Larson, ADFG, gave a brief report regarding assessment projects in the Kuskokwim. Some highlights include that coho salmon were just starting to pick up, that the Chinook, chum, and coho numbers are above average, while the sockeye numbers were a little below average at the sonar site, and that high water at Kogrukluk and George River weirs had caused gaps in counts and he does not know if he will be able to make an estimate for escapement, though the Talequena River weir was doing good but winding down. Mr. Larson finished with saying that Sam Decker had done aerial surveys.
 - Sam Decker, ADFG, said that all the upper Kuskokwim tributary surveys were finished but there were still rivers to do including the Kwethluk, Kanektok, and Kisaralik. Ms. Decker said that there were some waters clarity issues but the pilot she went with had commented that he was seeing more chum and Chinook salmon that last year, so she is hopeful. - Subsistence Division Update
 - Tim Bimbenic, ADFG, updated the group about the Post Season Survey project for this year. He said that the crew planned on starting in the upper and middle river during the 2nd week of September and Bethel in October. He said he was under the impression that there were no regulations. Sam Decker, ADFG, clarified that the BSAI trawl fleet and the Alaska Peninsula "intercept fishery" are different fleets and managed by different entities. She touched on some regulations that the different fleets have. Sean Larson spoke a little about what happens to the bycatch and the group discussed bycatch a little further afterward. Mr. Hunter said he would like to make sure that there are fish for subsistence, not just commercial interests. Albert Kawagley, Bethel, requested that someone from the trawling fleet attend a KRSMWG meeting. Sam Decker, ADFG, said that she had heard someone from NPFMC speak at a YRDFA conference and promised she would reach out to see if someone from NPFMC could attend a Working Group meeting.
