



In addition to the general permit conditions listed on and issued with the *2024 Southeast Alaska Subsistence and Personal Use Salmon Fishing Permit*, the following permit conditions apply to the Juneau Management area. **Personal Use Salmon Permit Conditions**

1. In the Taku River salmon may be taken only with set gillnets not exceeding 15 fathoms in length, only from the Taku River Lodge upstream to the U.S./Canada border, and only from July 22 through August 21. The permit holder is required to be physically present at the net while operating a set gillnet in the Taku River. Set gillnets may not be fished within 100 yards of Alaska Department of Fish and Game Taku River fish wheels.
2. In Sweetheart Creek salmon may be taken for personal use only upstream from an Alaska Department of Fish and Game regulatory marker located near the stream mouth. The use of spearguns and hook and line fishing for salmon are prohibited.
3. Chinook and coho salmon, trout and char may be taken only incidentally by gear operated under the personal use fishing guidelines of this permit. The personal use possession limit for Chinook salmon is 2 fish and for coho salmon is 6 fish.

<sup>a</sup>In the Taku River drainage, the total annual and possession limit for each personal use sockeye salmon permit is 10 sockeye salmon for a household of one person and 20 sockeye salmon for a household of two or more persons.

<sup>b</sup>The total annual limit is for the entire season from any combination of streams.



**Subsistence Salmon Permit Conditions**

1. Chinook salmon, trout and char may be taken only incidentally by gear operated under the subsistence fishing guidelines of this permit. The possession limit for Chinook salmon is 2 fish.
